Welcome to Whitfield Wildlife Conservation Area and our Junior Conservation Ranger Program.

To become a Junior Conservation Ranger, explore Whitfield's Visitor Center, gardens and trail. Learn about the land, the river, the plants and the animals that are here. This booklet will guide you as you explore Whitfield.

Whitfield Wildlife Conservation Area is home to many plants and animals. Please remember to respect their home as you explore:

- Leave things where you find them. Do not pick up or take anything—unless it's litter.
- Keep the wildlife area clean. Do not litter.
- Keep your distance. If you see an animal, do not attempt to feed or touch it

Instructions

Complete at least 1 activity for every year of your age. For example, if you're 5-years old, do 5 activities; do 8 if you're 8-years old; do 10 if you're 10 or older. Of course, you can do more than your age if you want.



There are 12 activities. A cottonwood tree holds each activity's number.

When you're finished, bring your book to the Visitor Center for review, then take the Whitfield Junior Conservation Ranger pledge and receive your Whitfield Junior Conservation Ranger award.


